....From Pastor Gary Kinkel

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

We have passed the midway point of my first summer at St. John's. Kay and I are so blessed to be here among you. I love coming in the doors every day! I love gathering with you on Sundays to worship the living God! It is such a privilege to be called to feed the flock of God with God's Word and to become so closely involved in your lives in order to bring that Word near. There are still so many of you I desire to know better; many of you with whom I want to have a more personal and direct conversation. But we have to be patient (me included!), that just takes time!

Meanwhile, it is Jesus who has called us together into his mission and cause. It is Jesus who is in our midst, the Lamb of God, who in every circumstance is the most potent presence—whether we recognize him, or have faith in him, or not! It is Jesus, the Crucified and Risen One, who is on the move in the world for the sake of its healing and redemption. And his presence and grace, his saving and healing power—directly available to us through simple faith and prayer—means we do not have to reel in fear, lose our balance or perspective or reach in panic for possible self-generated solutions to the terrible things we see around us and which touch us. We hear of violence every day. There is injustice and evil that is both socially systemic and individual and personal. There is threat that is quite real. But no human project and no human person can save us. But the true and real Savior is in our midst and he is on the move. So we live not by fear but by faith. We live not by anger, or vengefulness, or even by the desperate attempt to get things under our control. It is enough to know that the Savior is in control and we are free to be faithful; to take a cross (a CROSS—instrument of cruel torture and death) and follow the One who once for all bore our sins to that cross and destroyed the power of death for us. We carry a cross and live by the same grace that saves us. For we know the secret that the world's healing lies neither in "greatness" nor in "power," not even in "safety" or "security," but rather in the humble One from Galilee, who is God forever, and in his way of life. Jesus is in our midst, in humble mystery, in grace and power, the Lord of Life. How might he use us (me) to touch the world with his gracious healing, redeeming, saving, transforming power?

It is that question that burns before us as we read and hear the news. It is that question that needs to inform our gathering together. And it is that question that sends us to our knees to ask: How can we know the Savior better? How can we grow more deeply into his life and grace? How can we live faithfully and bear witness to his truth and grace, to his presence and his future? Because we cannot give away what we do not have. We cannot share what we do not yet possess ourselves. Come be with us on Sunday mornings to be healed, to be forgiven, to be transformed and sent into the world for Jesus' sake!
