....From Pastor Gary Kinkel

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

At the end of the fortieth chapter of Isaiah, the prophet declares:

The LORD is the everlasting God... [The LORD] does not faint or grow weary; [The LORD's] understanding is unsearchable. [The LORD] gives power to the faint, And strengthens the powerless... Those who wait for the LORD shall renew their strength, They shall rise up with wings like eagles...

Here at St. John's we are in the ground stages, the early beginnings, of renewal. We are laying the necessary foundation. This foundation includes giving up our own strength and relying on God's; laying down our own will and being caught up in God's; setting aside our own ways and ideas and following in God's; surrendering our desires in favor of discerning God's. God's will, God's desires, God's very heart is known and available to us through Jesus Christ, in his suffering, death and resurrection. So hearing good preaching is part of the foundation, too. Please make a point of being there so that you, too, can be part of St. John's renewal and rising. If you want to see me or talk to me, please do not wait for Sunday morning! Stop by the church, or give me a call. Invite me to your house. All of these work! Isaiah wrote (Isaiah 41:17-20) that this is what the LORD says:

When the poor and needy seek water... I will open rivers in the bare heights... I will make the wilderness a pool of water... I will set in the wilderness the cedar, the acacia, the myrtle and the olive... So that all may know that the hand of the LORD has done this, The Holy One of Israel has created it.

The LORD is on the move at St. John's and we are about to rise up!

Kay is a Licensed Graduate Social Worker (LGSW) who is currently working as a Care Coordinator with seniors who are members of the state health plans Minnesota Senior Care Plus (MSC+) and Minnesota Senior Health Options (MSHO) in Hennepin County. She meets with her clients to do health risk assessments, recommends equipment or services to help improve their quality of life, and does the follow up work of completing the government paperwork and ordering the equipment and services. She will talk to our group about how seniors can qualify for these programs, the services and equipment that are available through the programs, and simple tips that can help seniors live more safely and more fully.
