Grow Your Faith

Here is a great opportunity to grow in faith and understanding. Pastor Gary will be leading a book study through the season of Lent. The day and time will be decided (negotiated) by those interested in participating. We will read and discuss together Dietrich Bonhoeffer's powerful book, Discipleship. We will each buy a copy of the book and meet once a week until Easter to discuss portions of it. The book is an extended reflection on and interpretation of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7).

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ.

The Body of Christ that gathers here at St. John's has been shaken. When someone we love departs this mortal life it is always difficult for us. Grief overtakes us. Lots of different feelings come to us. During the past year, I have had the privilege of accompanying a number of saints on the final steps of their pilgrimage on earth. It is a holy time. As the psalmist reminds us, "Precious in the eyes of the Lord is the death of his saints." (Psalm 116:15)

But it hits us hard when someone young, someone in the prime of life, comes to the end of their days. It feels unfair. It feels like a violation of what is right. And it can leave us feeling desolate, abandoned and in doubt about whether God is here and whether God loves us. In the 8th chapter of Romans Paul says, "...even we who have the Spirit [of God] groan [at the way things happen in the world] as we wait...for the redemption of our bodies." (Romans 8:23) So where do we turn? How do we go on?

Paul goes on to say that we are saved in hope; that hope only makes sense if we hope for something we do not yet see or possess; and that we wait, then, with patience for that for which we hope. And our hope is grounded not in our experience, not in what we see and hear, sense and feel, but in what God has done. We do not look to our thoughts or our abilities. We look to Christ, crucified and risen. This thing has happened in the world. It is an event. Only in the cross of Jesus we know and are certain that God loves us. Only in the cross of Jesus and in his resurrection from the dead do we know that God is with us and has a future, a destiny, for us. Indeed, by faith we will share Jesus' destiny with the Father, we will share his life—if we share it even now. His resurrection contains the promise of our own. His resurrection points to the Final Feast of the Kingdom, in which we have a place by faith. His victory is ours by faith and we will share his glory. As Colossians puts it, "When Christ, who is your life, appears, then you also will be revealed with him in glory." (Colossians 3:4)

But we don't experience these things now. We do not see these things now. We live in the time between the times: between the resurrection of Jesus from the dead and his final appearing in glory. And in these days, we live by hope. But our hope is not empty or sentimental or based on fiction. It is a muscular and resilient hope that clings to Christ, who was crucified for us and raised for us. In this hope, let us support and encourage each other in the loss of our brother, let us believe and rejoice even in our tears. In the cross of Jesus Christ we know that he is safe and in peace. The Lion of the tribe of Judah has conquered, (Revelation 5:5) let us follow him!

Annual Meeting Highlights

If you missed the annual meeting on January 29, you will want to pick up a copy of the annual report and the narrative budget compiled by the stewardship team lead, Mollie Viola. The meeting's agenda appeared routine: new business, old business, reports, and budget. Beyond the routine, however, three highlights emerged.

First, I put out a call for committed volunteers. At this time, when Pastor Gary is working alone, we have the opportunity to show our dedication to using our hands to do God's work. Areas of greatest immediate need: care team helpers to visit members who cannot make it to church, a volunteer coordinator, ushers willing to come early or stay late to prepare for worship or close down after worship, and a pastoral care committee to support Pastor Gary.

Second, Mollie Viola presented the narrative budget, a new way of considering how St. John's uses its resources. Using pie charts and personal stories, the narrative budget tells how our time, talent, and treasure make an impact on our congregation and the community around us.

Finally, Erik Allen, treasurer, reviewed the 2016 budget, which showed an encouraging rise in giving. We give thanks to God and to those of you who contributed for this generosity. Erik then outlined the proposed 2017 budget, which carried unanimously.

In approving the 2017 budget, the congregation voted to allocate resources toward calling a full-time associate pastor. Expanding our clergy staff will allow us to build our volunteer and mission base. Pastor Linda McPeak, even though she worked far more than the half-time hours her salary covered, could not do everything she would have liked, in particular, ministering to our older teens and young adults—a population segment greatly at risk in our culture for falling away from the faith. A full-time associate will help us reach more of our teens and young adults.

St. John's seeks to be a faith home for all ages and a force of hope and help in the Shakopee community. Increasing our staff and telling our story are steps one and two toward becoming a spirit-filled example of Jesus' kingdom on earth.
