## From Pastor Gary Kinkel...

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The days have grown longer and the sunlight more direct as we move into summer. Glorious days loom up before us. There will be time outside with children, grandchildren, parents and friends. There will be swimming, baseball and softball, sand volleyball, outdoor basketball, tennis and golf. Some of us will take some time to camp and hike. Some will spend many hours gardening or landscaping. Some of us will take some extra time to relax and let stress run off our shoulders. Some will travel and some will keep our heads down, not notice the change of season, and work all the harder.

Whatever you choose to do this summer, there are questions that our culture persistently avoids. What does it all mean? What is the point? Why should I do anything at all rather than just nothing? To what does my life amount? Is it a tale told by an idiot, full of sound and fury, but signifying nothing? Or is it part of a much larger story involving the whole cosmos? Is it, perhaps, part of an epic involving dramatic rescue by extraordinary means? Is my life integral to this larger whole and just so, contrary to what I sometimes feel, filled in every detail with meaning and purpose?

Our culture carries on as if God does not matter. God is for private, inner consideration, or so it is suggested to us. We are urged to forget about such questions as meaning and significance; to ignore the desire to live a life that is authentic and true. "Just enjoy! Have fun! Shop!" Our culture shouts at us. But God does matter. In fact, nothing matters more. Our relation to God and to God's coming kingly rule in Jesus Christ is a matter of life and death. It is a matter of rescue and salvation on the one hand or utter ruin on the other. That's why we gather every Sunday. Don't take the summer off from God or from God's people. We will be here, hearing the Word by which we grow more deeply into God's grace and therefore into God's own life. Lifting our voices in praise and thanksgiving to God because God is worthy of all praise and thanks. And bringing the cry of our hearts before God, through Jesus in the power of the Spirit, in order that we might be more and more shaped to be like Jesus, indeed, to BE Christ to our neighbor. Without the gathering and without the preaching we just become more and more like our culture, more and more like the world around us and less and less like people of God. Join us. Everything depends on it.

#### I. Gathering

- A. Call to order: 7:05 pm Sandy McCullough, President.

  Sandy shared a note from the synod thanking St. John's for increasing our giving by 2% over last year.
- B. Motion to approve agenda: Pastor Gary Kinkel/Scott Wilts; carried.
- C. Scripture and prayer: Pastor Gary Kinkel, The Council in the Word Acts: 9:31-43

#### II. Discernment (New Business)

A. Website improvement – Pastor Jerod Freeberg gave a demonstration of the proposed new St. John's website. He will continue to research the costs involved with changing website providers and how quickly we can end our commitment with the current provider. Pastor Jerod is looking for a digital camera that takes high quality photos that can be posted on the new website, rather than using stock photography. Possibly a member of the congregation has a camera the church can borrow.

Motion to allow Pastor Jerod to continue moving forward with improvements and updating the website: Kirsti Youngs/Jenny Pudwill

Pastor Gary Kinkel proposed an amendment; there was no second.

Pastor Gary Kinkel called a question; motion passes.

B. Worship for the Three Days – Pastor Gary Kinkel proposed moving First Communion to a different day other than Maundy Thursday. Suggestions to have 1 or 2 students per Sunday have First Communion so it doesn't interfere with worship or have the class commune together during a designated worship service. Pastor Gary is also considering placing cardstock cards in the pews that explain the various elements of worship, so people understand their purpose and meaning. The intent is to have a plan in place before the start of the next Sunday school year.
