....From Pastor Gary Kinkel

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

I am slowly getting settled in at St. John's. It is wonderful to be with you. Kay and I love St. John's and we love Shakopee! So I want to make sure I don't get in the way of your ministry and your calling from God.

In the New Testament, James writes, "Are any among you sick? They should call for the elders of the church and have them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. The prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise them up; and anyone who has committed sins will be forgiven. Therefore, confess your sins to one another, so that you may be healed. The prayer of the righteous is powerful and effective." (James 5:14-16) Notice that it does not say that the prayer of the pastor is powerful and effective. It says the prayer of the **righteous** is powerful and effective. And the righteous are all those who are made righteous—justified--by God's grace through faith in Jesus Christ. Moreover, it does not say one should confess one's sins necessarily to the pastor, but rather "...confess your sins to one another..." The New Testament everywhere assumes a common and mutual ministry of care and prayer of the members of the Body of Christ **for one another**.

That is one of the important reasons that Luther attacked not only the teaching but also the structure of the church of his day. In one of his 1520 writings he said, "For whoever comes out of the water of baptism...is already consecrated priest...[and] we are all priests of equal standing..." Luther goes on to say those who are ordained simply have a special "office," a function, within the Body. The ordained are to be specially trained so that they may preach, teach the faith, celebrate the sacraments and train and prepare the people for their ministry. But much of the ministry of praying, visiting, caring, organizing, and creating new ministries is for the people to carry out in faithful response to God. We have done a great disservice to the people of God by having the church be centered around pastors for so long. We have hindered the people of God from exercising their faith by taking up the various ministries to which they are called.

Therefore, to be more faithful to the Lord Jesus and to the Reformation, St. John's is restarting a Care Team. The Care Team consists of people who hear God's call to a ministry of visiting and caring. They will begin to visit and, where desired, bring Holy Communion, after the bread and wine have been consecrated at the altar on Sunday morning. The pastor is still available, of course. Indeed, I am always only a phone call away! But some of the most important caring and visiting and praying ministry belongs to the people—not the pastor. Jesus is Lord.

St John's Evangelical Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes - May 17, 2016

Subject to council approval---May 2016 Minutes

Council Members Present: Sandy McCullough, Erik Allen, Jim Hime, Mollie Viola, Mark McGraw, Nancy Berndt, Patti Hayer, Renee Lea, Pastor Gary Kinkel, and Pastor Linda McPeak (All present)

Meeting called to order: Sandy McCullough, President @ 7:07

Devotions (Scripture and Prayer): Pastor Gary Kinkel - Acts 1:1-8

Old Business:

Erik Allen/Mark McGraw: Motion to approve council agenda: Carried

Previous council meeting minutes were approved earlier via email.

Erik Allen presented a verbal treasurer's report showing the general account in good shape at the end of April. Year to date building repair expenses and utilities are under budget. While offerings are down about \$5,000 for the year, the Spring Social brought in just under \$12,000 and a generous donation of \$1,300 was received from *Musicals With A Mission* from their spring show in addition to the charitable support they were able to provide.

Pastor Gary Kinkel /Nancy Berndt: Motion to approve the treasurer's report: Carried

Pastor Lind McPeak reported that the confirmation class chose the ELCA Good Gifts (water wells) charity as the target for the confirmation service offering. They were able to contribute \$1,000 toward that cause and Mark McGraw reported that *Musicals With a Mission* was able to contribute \$4,000 from the spring show towards the same charity bringing the total St. John's donation to \$5,000.

Pastor Gary Kinkel reported that the Visitation Team has been formed and there has been two meetings held. This group is divided into three sub-teams which target: 1) homebound and hospitalized, 2) follow up to visitors, 3) members who have fallen away. More volunteers are needed and the team will be actively recruiting other members.

Additional discussion was held on the effort to create the service volunteer base using the website VolunteerSpot.com. Additional brainstorming is needed on how to get people to sign up and training sessions are needed for the various duties. Currently too much burden is being placed on a few people.

Nancy Berndt reported she had 120 families signed up for the upcoming photography sessions for the new church directory. She also reported that the OWLS group volunteered to fill most of the greeter positions for the event. Photographing sessions in the library start at 2 PM with the church needing to be open by 1:30. Two to three viewing stations are planned.

Erik Allen recommended we go with an internal church audit and has guidelines to follow that he was able to get from his accounting firm. Sandy McCullough attempted to research what was done in the last internal audit but so far has not found the report. More investigation will be done on this front. An internal auditor still needs to be chosen.

Mollie Viola reported the discussion she had with the BIBBS group regarding a quiet play area for small children in services but there was concern over what the definition of quiet would be for small children in that setting. Conversation then focused on a system to periodically refresh the existing service activity bags that are available for small children in services.

Patti Hayer reported on the church social which all agreed was a success. Patti believes a lot was learned on what worked and what didn't. Next year's date has tentatively been set for 04/28/2017 but discussion is on-going to ensure there is no conflict with *Musicals With a Mission*.

Sandy McCullough brought to the council's attention the issue of insufficient budget funds for the Vacation Bible School (VBS) ministry. Pastor Linda McPeak estimated the expenses for this summer's session to be close to \$2,600. *Renee Lea made an initial motion to allocate funds for VBS out of the general fund not to exceed* \$2,000 *and Pastor Gary Kinkel seconded it*. Additional discussion led to an amended motion to cover the VBS expenses in the following way: 1) \$1,000 from the Youth (Restricted) Fund and 2) a General Fund allocation not to exceed \$2,000 offset by user fees of \$35 per participant. *This amended motion was made by Renee Lea and seconded by Erik Allen and unanimously carried.*

New Business:

Nancy Berndt brought up the concern that printed hymns and liturgical instructions in the bulletin need to be more accurate to help visitors. She indicated this was discussed with Sean Vander Veen and a plan is in place to resolve the issues.

Sandy McCullough reported that Rally Sunday is scheduled for 09/11/2016 and wanted the council to be thinking about events and activities for the day. It was agreed that we needed to look to groups to help set up the day. Renee Lea also indicated that a diaper drive is planned that day for Shakopee Community Assistance.

Sandy McCullough introduced a form to the council to be used by groups and individuals of the church to request council approval for fundraising and donation events. The intent is that all such requests must get council approval via council vote due to requirements of the church constitution and state law. A motion to adopt the form and the process of fundraising approval was made by Renee Lea and seconded by Mark McGraw and unanimously carried.

Stewardship discussion was tabled for the next meeting.

Mark McGraw/Erik Allen: Motion to adjourn: carried.
