From Pastor Gary Kinkel...

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Summer is almost here! By the time of the next newsletter it will be here! We are moving through the season of Easter, the fifty days of joy, towards Pentecost. Pentecost both brings the season of Easter to an end, and, more importantly, recalls the birth of the Church. Pentecost celebrates and reminds us that Jesus sent his Spirit, his very breath, which we call the Holy Spirit, into the church to give us gifts and power for mission, for the capacity to be witnesses of his resurrection and his Lordship.

But an odd thing happens in the summer. Right after we remember the power of the Spirit in the church, and our call to be part of God's mission to restore and heal and the whole creation, summer begins and people wander away from worship. But we, and the world, are still broken. Sin, in all its malignant reality, mangles and twists human beings and God's good creation. We cannot afford a "break" from forgiveness and healing. We cannot afford to miss being reoriented to God and to God's ways. We cannot afford to be absent from the announcement, the proclamation and interpretation of God's Word—the one and only thing we need for Christian salvation and life; the one and only thing that overpowers death and gains victory over the whole world. I cannot live without hearing the Word and joining with my sisters and brothers in prayer to and praise of the one, holy, Triune God.

Further, when we are absent from worship we have a tendency not to give to the church. Giving, contributing, is a very important part of our discipleship, our following of Jesus. If we are not contributing in real and concrete ways, if we are not making ourselves, our time, our gifts and our money available for God's mission our very discipleship soon becomes as ethereal and unreal as mist on a pond at dawn on a summer morning. It blows away and dissipates in the breeze and is gone. Moreover, the church continues, even if we do not take part in it. The doors have to be kept open and the lights on. But the church's continued life requires that we all continue to support the mission of God.

I hope to see you all here in the summer. Worship the Lord! Hear the Word! Be forgiven! Be raised from the dead! Be part of God's healing!

St John's Evangelical Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes February 20th, 2018

Gathering

The meeting was called to order at 7:04 PM on February 20th by Nancy Berndt. Scott Wilts agreed to be the timekeeper. Shelley Gehrman made and Pastor Gary seconded a motion to approve the agenda.

Pastor Gary led the council in a continuing study of the book of Acts beginning at the first verse of Chapter 6. He emphasized that the book of Acts is a model for how our churches should be today. Following that example, Pastors Jerod and Gary bear the same responsibilities as those first twelve disciples—praying and preaching the Word of God. As spirit-filled council members, we are to serve the church wisely as we obey the faith and love one another. Nancy distributed handmade wooden crosses and prayer cards to council members.

Discernment

- Nancy reviewed the ground rules for Council Meetings. The words "keep it real" will be deleted and the words "maintain respectful conversational boundaries" will be added. Nancy will add a reference to 1 John 4:10-11 to the updated ground rules.
- The Council will hold a retreat on April 7th from 12:30 5:00 PM.
- Pastor Gary, Pastor Jerod, and team leaders will send their respective reports for each upcoming council meeting to Kathy Larson.
 She will compile the reports and send a single e-mail to pastors and council members on the Sunday night one week prior to the council meeting. This process will ensure a more efficient use of time during the actual council meeting.
- The Spring Social is set for April 20th at Turtle's Bar and Grill.
- MWAM has designated Shakopee Loaves and Fishes as the recipient of funds raised by the spring musical performance. Jenny
 made and Aimee seconded a motion to give the money raised at the accompanying bake sales to the ELCA Youth Gathering.
 Motion carried.
- Nancy will write the next report for the newsletter. Council members are reminded that they are to provide sandwiches and dessert bars for and serve at the Lenten supper on March 21st.

Decisions

Minutes of the January 16, 2018, meeting were distributed and approved.

Pastor Gary highlighted action tracks for moving St. John's Church toward its vision for the future:

- A Book Club has begun meeting.
- Council members were given a handout for "Bread for the World" –a program started by an internationally known ELCA pastor.
- An "Offering of Letters" is a plea to inundate legislators with letters pleading for the protection of both SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) and WIC (Women, Infant, and Children) programs. Shelley made and Aimee seconded a motion to send information about the letter writing campaign to our congregation. Motion carried.
- A joint worship service with our congregation and Pastor José Luís' congregation is scheduled for Sunday, April 8th. Pastor Jerod reported that:
 - Aimee and Pastor Jerod will hold an open discussion on Vacation Bible School this coming Tuesday (February 27th). Goals of
 the meeting include hearing opinions and making decisions about this summer's program. Dates for Bible School, curriculum
 to be used, and funding available will be discussed.
 - Seven children plan to attend the ELCA Youth Gathering in Texas this summer. Three to five more youth may also attend. A number of adults have expressed interested in chaperoning the trip. Because the cost for each participant (attendee or chaperone) is nearly \$1500, Pastor Jerod would like to ask for funds from the Endowment Committee to use as scholarships for youth attending the event. Renee made and Kathy seconded a motion for him to make the request to the Endowment Committee. Motion carried. Pastor Jerod will also implement an "Envelope Drive" to raise an additional \$5050.

Erik Allen was not present but submitted a financial update via e-mail. Corroborating statements were attached.

Sending

The next **council** meeting date **is March 20, 2018.** Pastor Jerod led the council in closing prayer. He asked Jesus to draw us together as we read Gospel and serve the congregation. The meeting was adjourned at 8:52 PM.
