....From Pastor Gary Kinkel

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

There is a song by Bob Dylan (recipient of a Nobel Prize in literature) called, *Lord, Protect My Child*. The second verse of that song begins,

When the world is asleep

You can look at it and weep

Few things you find are worthwhile.

We give ourselves, our time, our energies, our money to lots of different things. Each time we do we bear witness to the regard we have for a person or thing. When we spend time or money, strength or skill, we reveal whether something is worthwhile to us or not. But there is a lingering question over each of our lives: Do we give ourselves to what is truly worthwhile, namely, what is eternally true, transcendently good and ultimately beautiful? Or do we settle merely for our personal preferences—without much concern about whether they reflect eternal truth, good and beauty?

Every day that question runs like a thread through all we do and say. Every Sunday that question hangs in the balance. We gather on Sundays to worship the One God who came to save us in Jesus Christ and who is present in the power of the Spirit. The word "worship" comes from an old Saxon word, "worthship." To worship is to render the "worth" of the one who is being worshipped. The word indicates an attitude of homage. The Hebrew word we usually translate as "worship" means to bow or to prostrate oneself, thus indicating that we regard the one worshipped as being of superior power and virtue.

On Sundays we gather, then, to bow before, to praise and listen to, to cry from the heart to, the Author of existence, the real Power behind every experience of power, the Life that gives life to all the living. We do so because this holy God has not remained anonymous or hidden behind an inscrutable silence. Rather, out of the darkness of eternity God has spoken in Jesus Christ. God has revealed in Jesus Christ that God loves us and seeks to heal and save us. Indeed, God means to do away with the great enemies that corrupt and destroy life—including death itself! Nothing is worth more than that. Nothing is more truthful, better or more beautiful than God in Christ through the power of the Spirit. Please join us this Sunday—and every Sunday—to help us bear witness to the overwhelming worth, goodness, truth and beauty of the living God. Let your neighbors, your friends, your relatives know what matters, what is worthwhile.

We will meet on November 2nd at 10:00 a.m. Pastor Gary will lead us in an exciting study of the Psalms. If you have a favorite Psalm or one you would like to learn about, let Pastor Gary know and he will try to honor your request.

The Psalms are an intriguing collection of Hebrew religious poetry. It is likely these prayers and lyrics were first transmitted orally from generation to generation. Finally, they were written down, compiled and set to music. They have been used in many different settings: devotional and prayer life; worship in temples, synagogues and churches; and on journeys and pilgrimages. They are still today an aid for people in search of God. They reflect the people of faith who sought help in God, and react with prayer and praise! Therefore, we will explore how they continue to be a source of comfort and meaning to people of faith today.

This book in the Old Testament has been called the Psalms. It has also been called the hymnbook of the Old Testament, or Songs of Praise for God's people, or a book of worship and praise for the Hebrew people or the prayer book of the Old Testament, etc. etc. Most of the Psalms were meant to be set to music. They were sung and chanted with the accompaniment of both wind and stringed instruments.


