From Pastor Gary Kinkel...

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Don't you love St. John's? I do. I love being here. I love gaining a sense of how the church year goes for the people of St. John's. I love getting to know you a little better all the time. I love dropping in on the Martha Circle and chatting with the ladies in the kitchen who do such wonderful work when we have a funeral. I love talking with you before and between services on Sunday mornings. I love running into you around town, say, in Target. I love checking in with you when you have stopped by church for an MWAM rehearsal or for some (any!) other reason. I love coming to your home to visit.

But most of all, I love bringing you the Gospel. Coming to you where you are with the Word of the cross of Jesus Christ. I love being able to be with you when something has happened that jolts us out of our normal routines and reminds us of how fragile we are and how dependent we are on the eternal God. I love being called to come to you in dark times and dark places to speak the truth that nothing can separate you from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord (Romans 8:39). I love praying with you and praying for you. I love the opportunity to open the Scriptures and by the power of the Holy Spirit to make them clear, to make them come alive.

Now we are preparing to add a new person to the St. John's staff. The ministry of St. John's will be enriched, deepened and expanded. We are moving into a new phase of our life together. I look forward to our future together with excitement!

And on top of everything else, we are approaching Advent! A new Church year is about to begin. The Church's year ends with Christ the King Sunday and the new year begins with the First Sunday of Advent. The word "Advent" means "coming" or "arrival." The Church season of Advent covers the four Sundays before Christmas and is a season of fasting (contrary to the way the society around us treats it!). Advent has a double meaning. It calls Christians to prepare ourselves and cry out for the coming of the King and his Kingly rule, or Kingdom. The double meaning is this: on the one hand, this coming is an event in the past (the birth of Jesus into the world), but on the other hand we look toward another event in the future, namely the coming of the Savior to set all things right in the universe, to save absolutely those who cast themselves on his grace and mercy, to make an end of evil, sickness, and death, and to cause all things to be subjected to God and God to be all in all (1 Corinthians 15:28). Advent is a good time to make our way back to worship if we have been away. Please don't miss out on the wonderful things that are beginning at St. John's. The Savior is in this place to forgive, save, heal and send us into new life. I look forward to seeing you on Sunday mornings!





St John's Evangelical Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes – September 19, 2017

I. Gathering

- A. The council meeting held on September 19, 2017 was called to order by Pastor Gary Kinkel at 7:05 PM. Council members Mollie Viola, Erik Allen, Renee Lea, Mark Mc Graw, Pastor Gary Kinkel, and Kathy Larson were present. Church members Tim Lea and Jim Johnston were also in attendance.
- B. Renee made and Mark seconded a motion to approve the agenda. Motion carried.
- C. Pastor Gary asked council members to focus on the fifth chapter of Acts; verses 12 through 16. Council then discussed ways the early church and St. John's are either alike or not alike and what our Lord is saying to us tonight. It is very apparent that healing is taking place in our church at this very time.

II. Discernment (New Business)

- A. Erik presented the Treasurer's Report, highlighting that current congregational giving is at 97.3% of budget. Mollie moved and Kathy seconded a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report.
- B. Pastor Gary reported on the following topics:
 - Rally Sunday: It was very successful with many people in attendance, great food available, and a number of books ordered.
 - <u>Adult Discussion Groups</u>: Two groups will begin or continue meeting this Sunday. The first group is studying the book <u>You Lost...Me</u>. It has met for a number of Sundays already. A second study group titled "Caring For The Earth" will be led by Del Lind beginning this Sunday, September 24th. A third adult study group will form later this school year.
 - <u>Small Group Ministries</u>: Because our congregation needs a rebirth in small group ministries, Pastor Gary is organizing a "team" that will make this happen. Pastor Gary explained that the "Fellowship Team" would provide opportunities for congregation members to become more associated with one another.
 - <u>Bible Study</u>: Pastor Gary envisions our congregation having great involvement in Bible study. He pointed out that scripture readings for the following Sunday are now printed in the current Sunday Worship Bulletin's "green sheet". Members of the congregation can use that information as a "heads up" in preparing themselves prior to the upcoming Sunday scripture messages.
- C. Jim Johnston and Tim Lea addressed the lack of volunteerism at St. John's. Jim pointed out that recent efforts to encourage church members to volunteer is clearly not working. Tim then reviewed highlights of a team concept that was used successfully in the past. According to that model, a few teams comprised of a number of families each would fill a variety of worship needs for a single month at a time. Service team responsibilities would include handling all aspects of serving Holy Communion, securing scripture readers, preparing Sunday morning coffee refreshments, and greeting/ushering visitors and members prior to each service. Tim will ask Lisa for an updated list of church members that he and Jim will use in forming teams and he will also present the overall plan to our congregation.
- D. A request has been made to establish an honorarium in the 2018 budget for someone to manage the "sound board" and to complete other tasks during Sunday worship services. Erik will explore synod guidelines for financial direction on this request and report back to the council.
- E. The Stewardship Committee has prepared for a successful campaign this fall. Church members will complete pledge cards detailing their time, talent, and financial commitments. "Pony Express" bags will gallop through the congregation and progress will be monitored by volunteers designated as "Round Up" leaders. The actual stewardship campaign will run from October 29th through November 19th. Pastor Gary emphasized that the Stewardship Committee has been working very hard and is doing a great job!

III. Decisions (Old Business)

- A. Members of St. John's are needed to represent the congregation as delegates at the Minneapolis Synod Assembly meeting to be held next spring. Pastor Gary will attend and Kay Kinkel will serve as one of the four or five lay delegates we are allotted. Other volunteer attendees are needed.
- B. The Call Committee has been very faithful in completing paperwork and interviewing candidates. At this time the committee is awaiting a new slate of candidates for prayerful consideration. In other words, the next step is up to our synod. Pastor Gary agreed to take several days of vacation prior to the physical and emotional taxing season of Advent.
- C. A final decision on the custodial position currently available at St. John's will be made at the October 17th Council Meeting. Candidates must have completed and turned in all necessary paperwork prior to that meeting.
- D. Pastor Gary made and Renee seconded a motion to approve these amended minutes for the August, 2017 meeting. Motion carried.
- E. Newsletter Assignment: Tim Lea will write an article for the October newsletter on the council's behalf. Mollie will also provide an article regarding the "Pony Express".

IV. Sending

- A. Updates were provided regarding Confirmation, Rally Sunday, Sunday School, and Small Group Formation.
- B. The next Council Meeting date is September 19, 2017.
- C. All present joined hands and prayed The Lord's Prayer together at the conclusion of the meeting.
- D. The Council Meeting was adjourned at 9:10 PM.
