From Pastor Gary Kinkel...

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

What a fall is underway! And I so glad to be here with you! So much is happening at St. John's! In the midst of it all, we pray for the riches of God's grace and the power of God's Spirit to be in evidence among us. It is a joy to be able to be part of the work that the Lord is doing at St. John's.

I hope you have caught that there will be multiple opportunities for adult discussions on Sunday mornings this year. I also hope that you will take advantage of one of them! Right now, there is a discussion of millennials and their relation to the faith and the church. There is also a very good discussion, led by pastor Del Lind, of how Christians are being called to care for God's whole creation. A little later in the fall, there will be a topical Bible study. This group will look at various topics and discuss together what the Bible actually says about them and what they mean for us. The first topic the group will focus on is the parables of Jesus. We will also have a discussion, on an as yet undetermined Sunday, led by Amy Schmidt on pre-planning your funeral and funeral service. Please join us for one—or more—of these opportunities! It is a great way to develop muscle in your faith and to get to know others in the congregation better.

This October is the 500th anniversary of Martin Luther's 95 theses. The publication of this writing was the event that launched the movement that historians call the "Reformation" (though Luther never called it that—nor did he use or even like the word "Protestant"). One of the things that plagues us is a deep forgetfulness of what the "Reformation" movement was about or meant. In tandem with that we have a bad memory concerning what being Lutheran is about and what it means. The new Marcus Theatre at Southbridge in Shakopee will be showing a new movie about Martin Luther, which was funded by Thrivent for Lutherans, at the end of October. We will have to go on a weeknight, but I would like to have a group of us attend the film. Then, probably not the same night, but I would like to have a group discussion of the movie. I am taking the confirmation classes to the film on the evening of October 25. The other evening showings will be Monday, October 23 and Monday, October 30. We will have to work out the details together, but please plan now to join me for this movie and discussion!

What new thing is the Lord calling you to do this fall? To give more? To get more involved with the children or youth of the congregation? To start reading the Bible more? To help with Loaves and Fishes? To be more regular in prayer? To start a new group or ministry at St. John's? To help get a fellowship team started and working? Maybe to work on small group ministry at St. John's? There are so many ways to serve and so much to do! The Lord is calling you!




News from the Sunday School Office...

St John's Evangelical Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes – August 15, 2017

I. Gathering

- A. This council meeting--held on August 15, 2017--was called to order by Sandy McCullough at 7:02 PM. Council members Sandy McCullough, Mollie Viola, Nancy Berndt, Erik Allen, Mark McGraw, Shelley Gehrman, Pastor Gary Kinkel, and Kathy Larson were present.
- B. Erik made and Mark seconded a motion to approve the agenda. Motion carried.
- C. Pastor Gary continued leading council through prayer and Bible Study based on Acts 5:1-11.

II. Discernment (New Business)

- A. Council members received a "Preliminary Report from the Vision and Long-Range Planning Team" which reflects the core values of St. John's Lutheran Church. Those values state:
 - · Our focus is Jesus.
 - We worship God in and through Jesus.
 - We live, love, and spread the Word as Jesus did.

Members of that committee include Pastor Gary, Mark McGraw, Scott Wilts, Jesse Rients, Tim & Renee Lea, and Deb & Kaitlin Rubash.

- B. Erik presented the Treasurer's Report, highlighting that current congregational giving is up 3% over monies received last year at this time. Council members will give prayerful consideration to items for the upcoming 2018 budget, including salaries and missional giving. At this time we have 1100 members in our congregation.
- C. Shelley moved and Erik seconded a proposal to give Lisa 80 hours of paid vacation at this time. Motion carried. Pastor Gary will share council's decision with Lisa.
- D. It was suggested that Pastor Jose be hired for 10 hours per week or \$800+ per month. No motion was made. Discussion highlighted the high quality of work Pastor Jose maintains regarding his janitorial responsibilities at St. John's.
- E. Although a discussion was held regarding the length of worship services here at St. John's, neither decisions nor motions were made.

III. Decisions (Old Business)

- A. A discussion regarding council membership was held. The only council position that must be replaced in January is that of president. All other positions are up for reelection except that of Renee Lea who has one more year to serve in her term. Council members Nancy Berndt, Mark McGraw, Mollie Viola, Kathy Larson and Shelley Gehrman have the choice to either serve another term or step aside and allow someone else to fill their decision-making roles at St. John's. Erik Allen's position has no term limit.
- B. Updates were provided regarding Confirmation, Rally Sunday, Sunday School, and Small Group Formation.
- C. Council Minutes
 - Pastor Gary made and Nancy seconded a motion to approve the amended minutes for the July 2017 meeting. Motion carried.
- D. Newsletter Assignment: Sandy will write a report for the next newsletter.

IV. Sending

- A. Updates were provided regarding Confirmation, Rally Sunday, Sunday School, and Small Group Formation
- B. The next Council Meeting date is September 19, 2017.
- C. Sandy McCullough closed the meeting with prayer.
- D. The Council Meeting was adjourned at 9:15 PM.
